FAES GRADUATE SCHOOL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

FAES expects to offer 30 scholarships in the fall semester and 20 scholarships for the spring semester.

The FAES Student Scholarship Fund can benefit self-funded researchers and scientists ONLY at all levels at the NIH who cannot obtain training funds to take an FAES Graduate School course as well as members of the general public who work in a health-sciences-related field or organization and have limited income.

FAES will only consider applications for one course per semester. Expenses for textbooks are not covered.

Review Criteria (merit and need based):

- Compelling justification for how the FAES Graduate School fits in with the career stage and overall career plan of applicant: evidence and commitment to continued professional development; explanation of how this learning experience builds on applicant's current professional knowledge and/or skills.
- Evidence and need for financial aid.
- Professional and academic achievements and standing to date.

Terms and Conditions:

Please note that the FAES Graduate School Scholarship can only be awarded to those applicants who are self-funded. If the NIH labs or employers would fund the remaining tuition, the applicant becomes ineligible for the scholarship.

The scholarship applicant agrees that s/he will take the course for CREDIT and will receive a "C," or above, or a "PASS" if course is graded as PASS/FAIL. If s/he fails to complete the course, or does not receive a passing grade, s/he will return the scholarship funds to FAES.
